

# Introducing the new instructors at AAH

## JEFFREY ROBERT BYE

The Art Association welcomes **Jeffrey Robert Bye** as instructor of Basic Oil Painting, substituting for Jonathan Frazier on sabbatical. Jeff Bye, from Brooklyn, NY, recently moved to the Central PA region and fortunately was able to step in as our oil instructor for spring and summer.

Bye's current body of work contains both figurative works and landscapes. His figurative pieces often include representations of friends and family members, as he feels that knowing the subjects on a personal level gives a greater strength to his work. This personal connection enables him to go beyond the painting of an anonymous portrait, reaching below the surface to ultimately reveal some aspect of the sitter's character in the painting.

On the other hand, Bye's landscapes record a moment in time within an urban setting, with each space having its own unique qualities owing to either inhabitants, architecture or history. He was fascinated with New York City's abundance of areas to explore, each with its integral character.

Jeff Bye is a welcome addition to our AAH School family! His Basic Oil class will welcome both beginners and the more advanced painter, and will be offered for spring Mondays, April 13-June 8, and for summer, July 15 through August 22.



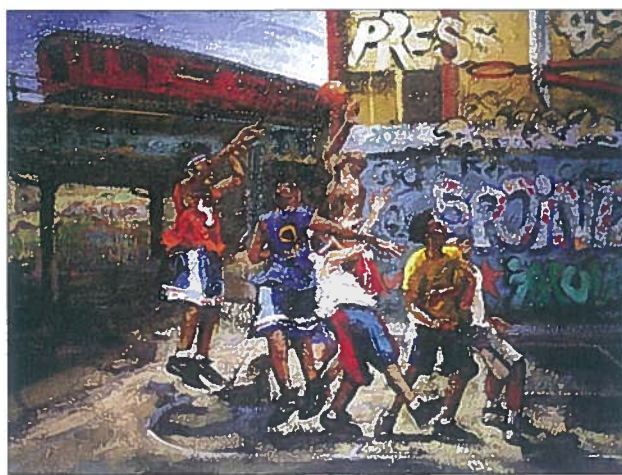
## CHRISTINE GOLDBECK

Digital Photography returns to AAH course offerings this summer with Christine Goldbeck's class in the summer semester. From July 16 thru August 6, Goldbeck will instruct artists on how to make photographs as visual aids for their art, as well as digital applications for exhibitions. Christine is not only a photographer, but also a writer and painter. Having earned her BFA in creative writing and history, and her MFA in interdisciplinary arts, Goldbeck was the recipient of a PCA Special Opportunity Stipend for her unpublished novel "Reclamation." She is a member of the Middletown Area Arts Collective, and is a book discussion facilitator and Commonwealth Speaker for the PA Humanities Council. She exhibits her artwork widely, and owns Arts on Union, a Middletown gallery and studio.

And, for something completely different, AAH will offer a soapmaking class this summer, taught by Gina Napoli. Napoli has had 8 years of soapmaking experience, and has published articles on the subject. Her varied formal education includes Lean Six Sigma Black Belt Continuous Process Improvement Training, New Leader Program in the US Dept. of Agriculture Graduate School, a Master of Public Administration from Penn State University, and a BA in Communications/Public Relations from California University of PA. Gina Napoli's soapmaking class will be held in the Multi-Purpose Studio in Reservoir Park from July 19 thru Aug. 23.

## DRAWING

### Basic Drawing

(Ages 15 through Adult, AAH Lower Level, 6 weeks)

This course develops creativity through basic drawing skills. Emphasizing observation, exercises in pencil, colored pencil, charcoal, ink and pastels will be offered. Students will be encouraged to keep a sketchbook and all levels of experience are welcome.

### Portraiture

(Ages 19 through Adult, AAH 3rd Floor, 6 weeks)

A tangible course in portrait drawing, focusing on capturing a likeness as well as a mood. Composition, light, shadow and form will be discussed. We start out in black and white and later proceed to color. Working with graphite pencils or vine charcoal on a tinted paper is recommended for the first stage. For color portraiture, the instructor uses pastels. Students may also enjoy working in ink, watercolor, oil or any other medium in which they are experienced.

## CERAMICS & SCULPTURE

### Beginning Pottery

(Ages 15 through Adult, Reservoir Park Pottery Studio, 6 weeks)

Recommended for those who have never participated in a clay class, students will learn to build with clay using coil, slab and free-form techniques. Clay, glazing and firing costs are included. **Additional clay may be purchased at \$10 per bag.**

### Advanced Glazing Techniques

Students who are confident in pottery via hand-building or wheel-throwing will learn exciting methods of mixing and applying glazes. The focus of the class will be on the technical aspects to formulate, document and achieve consistent results in personally-unique glazes. Students are encouraged to pursue individual areas of interest in specific glaze types and techniques, and prior basic glaze experience is preferred. ### Introduction to Sculpture Using Wood & Metal\*\*

(Ages 15 through Adult, Reservoir Park Sculpture Studio, 6 weeks)

This class will begin with a review of significant works of the 20th century, including works by Louise Nevelson and Richard Serra. The first half of the class will focus on wood and the second, metal. Artwork will be made from found objects, as well as materials provided by the instructor, with additional materials being purchased by the students from a provided list. Wood selection, paints and stains, cutting, carving and sanding, ferrous and non-ferrous materials, cold weld adhesion, shaping and forming metal will be explored. Each student will sketch ideas, study models for review and produce two final sculptures (one wood and one metal) during the course. All levels of interest are welcome.

Students will work from photos, still-lives, and sketches. Demonstrations will be included. Experienced students may use this class to expand their skills and may work independently. The class is appropriate for both the beginner and the more advanced student.

## Soap-Making

(Ages 18 through Adult, Multi-Media Studio, Reservoir Park, 6 weekends)

This class covers both beginning and advanced soap-making. Students will learn how to make two different kinds of soap: melt-and-pour glycerin, and cold-process lye. Topics covered will include soapmaking safety and equipment; creating your own recipes; using molds, soap additives and colorants; working with lye and fats; temperatures in processing; re-batching failed soap; safe clean-up; and packaging. Call AAH for a supply list before first class! Students may purchase raw ingredients from instructor for \$10. (Each recipe will be enough to make approximately 11 four-ounce bars of soap.)

# Call for Entries: Annual Art School Exhibition

**Exhibition Dates:** June 26 – July 23, 2009

**Reception and Awards Ceremony:** Friday, June 26, 5–8pm

**Artist Eligibility:** Youth and adult artists who attended AAH classes between **June 1, 2008, and June 1, 2009.** (*Instructors are eligible to enter the show with two entries each, but not to compete for prizes. Faculty work will be hung in a separate second-floor gallery.*)

**Intake Dates:** Monday, June 8, through Monday, June 22, during regular gallery hours.

### Rules of Entry:

- Each artist may enter **two works** from **each different class attended** in the past year.
- No work may be no larger than **48"** in any direction.
- **All ADULT** two-dimensional artwork must have screw eyes and wire on back for hanging.
- **All YOUTH** two-dimensional artwork must be either framed with screw eyes and wire, or matted and shrinkwrapped to hang with binder clips.
- No unframes or exposed glass edges

**Entry Fee:** \$10 per entry

Entry forms will be available to fill out at the receptionist's desk when art is delivered.
